We lost the person that hired me in 2021, Will Wofford. He was a great friend and boss who allowed me to be free to make decisions that impacted the quality of our laboratory. Will dealt with some personal challenges, but he was always there in the trenches to help resolve issues. I will always be grateful to Will Wofford and OKCIC's **CEO Robyn Sunday-Allen for allowing** me to be a part of this team.

When I moved away several years ago from Oklahoma, after retiring from the Air Force, it became a goal of mine to move back here specifically in order to work at OKCIC. As a matter of fact, I came here a couple of years before

joining OKCIC and I noticed a

clinic T-shirt hanging in the window at administration. I purchased my first "team" shirt well before I was hired and I have not looked back.
